

Tri-County League Baseball

Pitching Rules

- A. Once a pitcher is removed from the pitching position, they may not re-enter the game as a pitcher, but may re-enter the game in any other defensive position.
- B. A pitcher is charged with the number of pitch counts pitched on the specific calendar day and week in which they are pitched, whether they are local league, traveling league, or suspended.
- C. If a pitcher reaches the limit while facing a batter, the pitcher may continue to pitch until any one of the following conditions occur:
 - 1. That batter reaches base.
 - 2. That batter is put out.
 - 3. The third out is made to complete the half inning.
- D. The home team score keeper must provide the current pitch count for any pitcher when requested by either the head coach or the umpire.
- E. The head coach is responsible for knowing when his pitcher must be removed.
- F. All head coaches must have their score keeper sit behind the back stop at each game.
- G. All score keepers must inform the home plate umpire when a pitcher delivered his maximum limit of pitches for the game. The home plate umpire will inform the pitchers head coach.
- H. The pitch count format is:
 - 9/10 age group is 75 pitches per day
 - 11/12 age group is 85 pitches per day
 - 13/14 age group is 95 pitches per day
 - 15 & up age group is 105 pitches per day
- I. All baseball age groups
 - 61 pitches & up requires 3 calendar days rest
 - 41-61 pitches requires 2 calendar days rest
 - 21-40 pitches requires 1 calendar days rest
 - 1-20 pitches requires 0 calendar days rest
- J. The calendar week is 12:01 AM Monday, through midnight the following Saturday.
